Creator Ben Branson was bored of sweet, fizzy drinks, and he combined six botanicals to make Seedlip: allspice, grapefruit, lemon peel, cardamom, American oak and cascarilla bark. Together, they make a fresh, warming drink that is full of flavour but is alcohol free.

SEEDLIP GARDEN 108 £2.30

(NON-ALCOHOLIC SPIRIT)

The second bottling from Seedlip is a celebration of summer – a non-alcoholic spirit that bursts with clean, fresh herbal flavours. Perfect for designated drivers or if you're not drinking at the moment, it's great served long with bitter lemon or soda water over ice.

Creator Ben Branson won't say exactly how he makes Garden 108, but he has revealed that he uses a combination of distillates: hay, pea, spearmint, rosemary, thyme and hop. The result is a flavour-packed drink perfect for summer sipping. It's also sugar- and calorie-free.

Silent Pool £3.95

Silent Pool Gin is named for the eponymous lake near to where it is produced in Surrey. Juniper-driven with notes of lavender, chamomile and citrus, there is also some local honey in the mix.

Berry Bros & Rudd No3 London Dry £3.25

An impressive-looking premium gin from famous wine and spirits merchants Berry Bros & Rudd, No. 3 London Dry is distilled in copper pot stills at De Kuyper in the Netherlands, counts cardamom seeds and grapefruit peel among its botanicals, and has been bottled at an invigorating 46%.

Brockmans £3.35

Flavoured with 10 botanicals, Brockmans premium gin is fruity and equally at home in a gin and tonic or with ginger ale, as well as just on its own over ice.

Eden Mill Love Gin £4.00

A pink-tinged gin from Eden Mill using rose-coloured botanicals including rose petal, hibiscus, raspberry leaf and rhubarb root, this is extra floral with sweet vanilla notes.

William Chase Seville Orange Gin £3.80

After the roaring success of their Seville Orange vodka, here come Hereford's Williams Chase with the same formula aplied to their marvellous gin (made with organically grown apples, don't you know). An absolute joy, wonderful in G&Ts and we'd wager this would make a pretty mean alternative to a Negroni too, perhaps with a splash of Aperol.

Beefeater 24 £3.00

The inclusion of Japanese Sencha and Chinese Green Tea in the botanical blend distinguishes Beefeater 24 from any other gin, helping to shape its unique aroma and smoothness, while the addition of grapefruit peel ensures that Beefeater's signature citrus flavour remains present.

Greenall's £2.80

A traditional-style gin from the historic Greenall's in Warrington. The company have been distilling since 1761 and have since grown to become the UK's second-largest distillery, with operations presided over by Joanne Simcock, the UK's only female master gin distiller.

Bombay Sapphire £2.90

Trendy younger sibling to Bombay Original, on whose recipe it is based (with a couple of extra botanicals). Credited with kick starting gin's fashionability since its launch in 1987, Bombay Sapphire has become a truly iconic brand, with its distinctive blue bottle recognisable in bars the world over.

Hendrick's £3.80

A superb, and utterly unique, pink-tinged gin from William Grant's. Infused with rose petals and cucumber as well as the normal botanicals, this is a must for all gin-lovers. In the Summertime, Hendrick's makes a fantastically refreshing Gin & Tonic: serve in a tall glass with plenty of ice and garnish with thinly-sliced cucumber - delicious!

Tanqueray 10 £4.00

A super-premium small-batch Tanqueray gin named after the number of the No.10 still in which it is made. A superb controlled explosion of botanical flavours, with much more citrus character than its Export Strength cousin.

Masons Dry Yorkshire Gin £3.75

Masons Gin is made in the town of Bedale in North Yorkshire. Produced in 200-litre batches using juniper from the distillery's own bushes, along with a secret blend of botanicals, this makes a citrusy G&T.

Sipsmith Sloe Gin £3.75

One of Sipsmith's most euccessful releases – a sweet, fruity and complex sloe gin. Made from their award-winning gin and rather a lot of sloe berries it's a rich liqueur that's great for summer drinking on ice or nursing in front of the fire in winter.

Malfy con Limone £2.75

Malfy Gin is made in Turin using lemons grown in Siciliy and on the Amalfi coast, as well as botanicals including juniper, coriander, angelica and cassia bark.

Greenall's Bloom £3.50

Not quite like any other premium gin. It's light, delicate and floral with a totally unique slightly sweet taste created by a bespoke blend of 3 botanicals: honeysuckle, chamomile and pomelo.

Haymans Old Tom £3.00

A botanically intensive and flavourful gin, with a hint of sweetness, Old Tom Gin delivers a more rounded and softer profile than dry gins. This quintessentially English gin was the gin of choice during 19th century Victorian

England.

Daffy's Gin £3.50

Small batch, copper pot-distilled gin from Scotland, with a hint of Lebanese mint and eight other botanicals.

The Botanist £3.50

An exciting and unusual gin from Islay whisky distillery Bruichladdich, The Botanist is made in a Lomond still christened Ugly Betty and contains no fewer than 31 botanicals, of which 22 are native to the Southern Hebridean island itself. These latter include the likes of mugwort, meadowsweet and the enigmatic Lady's Bedstraw flowers, and the resultant dry gin is described, perhaps unsurprisingly, as 'floral'.

Citadelle French Gin £4.00

A French gin distilled in small charentais pot stills using a mixture of 19 botanicals, which are listed in the design on the bottle.

Tanqueray Rangpur £3.50

The rare Rangpur lime traditionally used to smooth down the gin brings an exotic bold flavour to the already perfect combination of Juniper, Coriander, Bay leaves and Ginger.

Aviation Gin £3.50

New batch-distilled US gin. Distillers Lee Medoff and Christian Krogstad have teamed up with Seattle mixologist Ryan Magarian to produce a new gin based on the fuller-bodied Dutch style with rye neutral grain spirit and what they describe as a 'botanical democracy' of Juniper, Cardamom, Coriander, Lavender, Anise, Sarsaparilla and Orange Peel.

Citadelle Reserve French Gin £4.75

A unique aged French gin produced in very small quantities in Château de Bonbonnet by the cellar master of Cognac Ferrand. Citadelle Gin Reserve is also matured for 6 months in old oak casks.

Drumshanbo Gunpowder Irish Gin £5

Drumshanbo Gunpowder Irish Gin is an oriental-inspired spirit from The Shed Distillery in Co Leitrim. Taking its name from one of the signature botanicals, slowly dried Gunpowder Tea, the recipe also includes lime, lemon and grapefruit. This will work best with a Mediterranean tonic water.

Gin Mare - Spain £3.90

Mare is a Mediterranean gin flavoured with four principal botanicals: basil, thyme, rosemary and, most unusual of all, the Arbequina olive. Alongside juniper, cardamom and citrus, these different botanicals create a strangely arresting gin.

Jinzu £3.50

Jinzu is a hybrid spirit, combining Scottish gin from Cameronbridge with distilled sake, cherry blossom and yuzu fruit.

THE LONDON NO.1 ORIGINAL BLUE GIN £3.25

A high-strength (47%) gin quadruple-distilled in London by master distiller Charles Maxwell, The London Gin has a variety of traditional botanicals inlcuding cinnamon, orange root and angelica alongside less-common ingredients like gardenia and bergamot, which explains its distinct aromas of Earl Grey tea.

Monkey 47 - Schwartzwald £6.00

A curious gin from the Black Forest in Germany. Made with 47 (yes, really) botanicals and bottled at 47%, they also use a 'secret weapon typical to the Black Forest' in the mix – cranberries.

Conker Dry Gin £4.00

Conker Spirit's Dorset Dry Gin is distilled using British wheat spirit, New Forest spring water and 10 botanicals, including some rather distinctively-Dorset-inspired botanicals - Gorse Flowers, Samphire and Elderberries.

XR G'Vine Nouaison Gin £4.00

G'Vine is batch distilled using a neutral grape spirit and fresh whole-fruit botanicals in France's Cognac region. Complex, intense and spicy, G'Vine Nouaison is for gin connoisseurs an original and elegant alternative to traditional dry gin.

Martin Miller's Gin £3.00

In a break with tradition, there are two separate distillations for the juniper and earthier botanicals that are later 'married' or blended with a second separate distillation of the citrus elements of bitter orange peel from Seville, lemon and lime peel.

PIMM'S

THE ORIGINAL NO.1 £5 / £20

The rich amber hue of PIMM'S No. 1 comes from infusing lots of lovely gin with herbal botanicals, caramelised orange and delicate spices.

BLACKBERRY & ELDERFLOWER £5 / £20

The combination of big fruity blackberries and delicate elderflower is based on the old Vodka cup, giving you a cheeky twist on the classic No.1 fruit cup.

PIMM'S VODKA CUP £5/£20

Vodka-based version of the classic summer refresher.

STRAWBERRY £5 / £20

Introduced in 2015, the latest special edition sees Pimm's gin-based No.1 combined with strawberries and a hint of mint.

WHISKY

Although made from very simple materials – malted barley, water and yeast – the make of each distillery has an individual character, owing to a variety of factors, such as the length of fermentation time, the style and size of the stills, and how they are operated, the type of condensers used and amount of spirit saved (called 'the cut'). Since at least the 1880s, blenders have identified different styles of whisky coming from different parts of Scotland. The original division, dating from the 1780s, was between 'Lowland' whisky and 'Highland' whisky. Then the whiskies made in Campbeltown and Islay were discerned to be different, and the whiskies of Speyside were added to the list. With the dramatic growth of interest in single malt whiskies since the 1980s, the 'Highland' region has been sub-divided into Northern, Western, Eastern, Southern and Islands.

CAMPBELTOWN SINGLE MALT SCOTCH WHISKY

Campbeltown was once a thriving malt whisky region of no fewer than 34 distilleries – no mean feat for a small and remote settlement at the bottom of the long Kintyre peninsula. Now only three producers remain, but they make up for their paucity by producing five distinctive malt whiskies between them.

HIGHLAND SINGLE MALT SCOTCH WHISKY

Scotland's largest whisky region boasts a dizzying array of styles, from rich and textured to fragrantly floral, as befits an ever-changing landscape of coastline, moor and mountain. Even without the famed Speyside enclave, you'll find some of whisky's most famous names here – and some of its most fiercely individual spirits.

ISLAND SINGLE MALT SCOTCH WHISKY

There are nearly 800 islands scattered off Scotland's crenelated coastline, of which only a few are inhabited – and fewer still have a distillery. Excluding the whisky hotspot of Islay, the islands of Arran, Mull, Jura, Skye, Lewis and Orkney are home to an eclectic mix of styles, from light citrus to full-on peat smoke.

ISLAY SINGLE MALT SCOTCH WHISKY

The southernmost of its island chain, Islay is known as 'The Queen of the Hebrides' – and is certainly the reigning monarch of a typically smoky, peaty style of single malt whisky. But there's much more to this beating heart of distillation, which has eight active producers – and more to come.

LOWLAND SINGLE MALT SCOTCH WHISKY

There's more distillation in the Lowlands than any other Scottish region, but its days as a significant single malt player are consigned to history. This is the home of the blend, and of the large quantities of grain whisky which form its foundation – but a few producers keep up the trademark light and grassy Lowland malt style.

SPEYSIDE SINGLE MALT SCOTCH WHISKY

Broadly speaking, Speyside whiskies can be classified as falling into one of two camps. At one end of the spectrum there are the light, grassy, 'lunchtime whiskies' such as Glenlivet; at the other end lie the rich, sweet, sherried qualities of Glenrothes and Macallan.

JAPANESE WHISKY

If the finer points of Japanese culture can prove elusive to the Western psyche, much the same could be said for the country's whisky. While there may be echoes of Scotland in the distilleries of Honshu and Hokkaido, the huge variety of production techniques produces multifaceted whiskies with an identity all their own.

BUNNAHABHAIN 12 YEAR OLD - ISLAY £4.50

With a subtle whiff of smoke floating through the air, the taste starts with a light fruit and nut appeal that leads to a spectacular malty sweetness.

LAPHROAIG 10 YEAR OLD - ISLAY £4.00

Laphroaig 10yo is a full-bodied, smoky gem, with a residual sweetness and a hint of salt amidst the seaweedy, peaty characters before a long warming finish. A classic dram.

LAPHROAIG QUARTER CASK - ISLAY £4.00

Aged in Quarter Casks. This shows soft sweetness and a velvety feel when first tasted, then the intense peatiness so unique to Laphroaig comes bursting through.

BRUICHLADDICH LADDIE CLASSIC - ISLAY $\pounds 4.50$

The first of a new series from Bruichladdich, this Laddie Classic is a no-age-statement bottling intended, as the name would suggest, to showcase the classic 'Laddie' style.

LAGAVULIN 16 YEAR OLD - ISLAY £5.60

A deep, dry and exceptionally peaty bruiser. Probably the most pungent of all Islay malts, not for the faint-hearted but inspires fanatical devotion in its many followers.

OBAN 14 YEAR OLD - HIGHLAND £4.75

The Western Highland representative in Diageo's 'Classic Malt' series, Oban 14yo is a superb, full-blooded fruity malt with a whiff of heather and more than a hint of smoke.

GLENMORANGIE 10 YEAR OLD - HIGHLAND £3.50

The 'original' sets a high standard for Highland whisky. Medium-bodied and gently warming, with pleasant spicy notes.

GLENMORANGIE LASANTA 12 YEAR OLD SHERRY FINISH - HIGHLAND £4.00

Glenmorangie Lasanta now boasts an age statement of 12 years old. Lasanta is an oloroso-sherry-finished Glenmorangie and is said to mean 'warmth and passion' in Gaelic.

AUCHENTOSHAN CLASSIC BOURBON OAK CASK LOWLAND £3.25

A no-age-statement Auchentoshan released in 2008, Classic is aimed at drawing in new drinkers to malt whisky, and has the easy-going drinkability to do the job.

GLENLIVET FOUNDERS RESERVE - SPEYSIDE £3.50

The Glenlivet Founder's Reserve is a unique tribute to George Smith's vision to create the definitive smooth Speyside malt. At its heart is the perfectly balanced, smooth fruity flavour The Glenlivet is renowned for. It is skilfully complemented with a creaminess and sweetness from the addition of First Fill American oak casks.

DALWHINNIE 15 YEAR OLD - HIGHLAND £4.50

A good introduction to the delights of single malt whisky - elegant, smooth and medium-bodied with a light, fruity palate and a whiff of heather on the finish.

SUNTORY YAMAZAKI 12 YEAR OLD JAPAN £7.00

A pioneering malt in Japan, for which Suntory deserve great credit. In its early days, it was rounded and delicate...now it is more intense, confident and elegant.

SUNTORY HIBIKI 17 YEARS OLD - JAPAN £11.00

A Japanese blend, made with aged malt and grain whiskies from Suntory's three distilleries. Spicy and sophisticated.

ISLE OF JURA 10 YEAR OLD - ISLANDS £3.75

Medium-bodied with a delicate sweet palate, with a hint of brine developing on the finish.

TALISKER 10 YEAR OLD - ISLANDS £4.00

Talisker 10yo's profile keeps increasing as more fans discover its intense coastal spicy, peaty character. A truly elemental malt.

HIGLAND PARK 12 YEAR OLD - ORKNEY £3.35

One of the gold standard malts for other distillery bottlings to aspire to. With a delicious sweetness and a warming, silky mouth feel, this is a whisky that never lets you down.

THE MACALLAN GOLD - SPEYSIDE £3.95

Produced from 9-15yo first fill and refill sherry casks, it was designed to sit between the now-defunct 10yo Sherry Oak and 10yo Fine Oak bottlings.

GLENKINCHIE 12 YEAR OLD - LOWLAND £4.25

Replacing the 10 year-old as the main expression of the Lowland style in the Classic Malts range, this Glenkinchie 12yo is a bit fuller and more complex.

HAZELBURN 10 YEAR OLD - CAMPBELTOWN £4.50

First released in 2014, this is the first bottling of Hazelburn at 10 years of age. Hazelburn is Springbank's tripledistilled, unpeated single malt.

BOURBON

KNOB CREEK £3.50

Created to represent whiskey before it was mass produced, Knob Creek embodies the look, feel and taste of preprohibition bourbon. This is a long-aged, high-rye bourbon

BULLEIT £3.50

The high rye content (around 30%) gives this bourbon a spicy kick.

BULLEIT '95' RYE FRONTIER WHISKEY £4.00

A 95% rye mash whisky. Astringent and spicy, showing what the flavour of rye is all about.

WOODFORD RESERVE £4.00

Rich and full bodied with a sophisticated range of flavours. Excellent as a digestif after a rich meal.

MAKER'S MARK £2.75

One of the rising stars in the premium bourbon market

WILD TURKEY 101 £2.75

America's biggest-selling premium bourbon, the much-loved Wild Turkey 101 is a richly-flavoured concoction with a mellowness that belies its high strength.

RUM

HAVANA CLUB ANEJO BLANCO RUM £2.70

Still being distilled in Cuba, this delightful white rum is what the islanders use for their Mojitos. And if it's good enough for them...

HAVANA CLUB 3 YEAR OLD RUM £2.95

Probably the most prestigious light Cuban rum, Havana Club 3 year old infuses an extra touch of quality into rum cocktails and is great with just about any mixer we can think of.

HAVANA CLUB ANEJO ESPECIAL RUM £2.85

A quality mixing rum from Cuban maestros Havana Club, Anejo Especial contributes plenty of flavour to classic rum cocktails, but can also be enjoyed on its own with ice.

HAVANA CLUB 7 YEAR OLD RUM £3.85

Havana Club 7yo is a full-flavoured, rich and sophisticated Cuban rum with a high degree of elegance and class. A deservedly popular rum.

KRAKEN BLACK SPICED RUM £2.95

Chairman's Reserve is a blend of double distilled pot still and continuous still rums from the beautiful island of St. Lucia. A worthy winner of a Gold Medal and 'Best in Class' award at the International Wine and Spirit Competition 2008.

SAILOR JERRY SPICED RUM £2.50

This is the latest version of Sailor Jerry rum, which was re-formulated in early 2010 to bring it into line with the US recipe. This version contains less vanilla and lime than the previous edition and is more popular with bartenders.

SANTA TERESA 1796 RUM £5.00

Magnificent Venezuelan rum aged in a solera system, Santa Teresa 1796 has established itself in top bars as one of the best South American rums in the world. A deserving winner of a Gold Medal and 'Best in Category' at the International Cane Spirits Festival 2007.

VODKA

ABSOLUT £2.50
