## Fruit Driven & Aromatic

- Ca' di Ponti Grillo, DOC Sicilia 2018** 25.00  
*A honeyed, floral and spicy nose with hints of ginger and stone fruit. Ripe, sun-dried citrus characters on the palate with savoury notes and a creamy texture. Fresh balancing acidity on the lightly nutty finish*
- Wandering Bear Chardonnay – California, USA** 22.50  
*Feel free to murmur appreciatively as you enjoy this tangy, fruity Chardonnay.*
- Riesling Jean Biecher – Alsace** 27.50  
*This dry white wine is characterised by an intense freshness. It has aromas and flavours of citrus fruit, intertwined with more tropical fruit notes of peach and melon. A medium-bodied wine, with a rich and creamy texture.*
- Jean Biecher Pinot Blanc – Alsace, France** 27.50  
*The forgotten Pinot, and undeservedly so. Soft, lightly peachy and fresh with delicate white flowers, this Alsace Pinot Blanc is beautifully food-friendly and subtle.*
- Le Versant Viognier– Languedoc, France** 29.50  
*Wonderfully aromatic with peach and plump dried apricots on the nose. The palate is soft and fruity, with more stone fruit, a hint of spice and a fresh finish.*
- Bulgarini Lugana DOC – Lombardy, Italy** 32.50  
*If you like softer, nuttier whites but without the spice and weight of oak, you will adore this elegant, slightly peachy Lugana. Soft, supple and graceful wine with a fresh finish.*
- Marotti Campi Verdicchio dei Castelli di Jesi Classico Superiore Luzano, Marche, Italy** 24.50  
*Situated near the medieval village of Morro d'Alba on Italy's stunning Le Marche region, they focus on two indigenous varieties: Lacrima and Verdicchio. Aromas of acacia, wildflowers, chamomile and almonds. Dry and savoury, with a pleasant crisp finish.*
- Gavi di Gavi, Enrico Serafino, Piemonte, Italy** 29.50  
*Made from Cortese grapes grown in the historical part of the Gavi village area in the heart of the appellation and from the best vineyards. It's one of the most successful and appreciated wine from Piemonte. Unoaked, the wine spends a little time on its lees to develop a richer mouth-feel. The wine has a beautiful minerality and acidity with a citrus and floral bouquet.*
- Greco di Tufo, Rocca del Dragone, Tre Fiori, Campania, Italy** 29.50  
*The Greco grapes for this zingy, aromatic white come from vineyards in the communes of Tufo, Altavilla Irpina and Montefusco, in Italy's southern region of Campania. The mature vineyards lie at an altitude of 550 to 650 metres above sea level, here they benefit from cooler ripening conditions. After harvesting by hand, the bunches are destemmed and crushed before the must is left for 36 hours to rest prior to a cool fermentation at 15 to 16°C, three months of lees ageing follows. The bouquet offers aromas of almond and honeysuckle, the palate is well-balanced, crisp, lively and complex, with a refreshing minerality and hints of grapefruit, melon and orange zest.*

<b>Alois Lageder Porer Pinot Grigio 2018, Trentino-Alto Adige, Italy</b>	39.50
<i>Alois Lageder is an ultra-sustainable biodynamic estate established in 1823 and is a true pioneer of biodynamic principals in Italy. Rich in body with a lot of tension. Fresh and fruity with melon and peach flavours, and a touch of spice and minerality.</i>	
<b>Nederburg The Beautiful Lady Gewürztraminer, Stellenbosch, SA</b>	35.00
<i>A single-vineyard Gewürztraminer sourced from a single-vineyard block in the Stellenbosch region. The south-westerly facing vineyard block was planted in 1988 and is situated 210m above sea level on the Simonsberg. The wine takes its name from a description of Ilse Graue, the wife of Johann Graue, by former winemaker Günter Brözel reflecting the 'gracious sense of hospitality' she brought to Nederburg. The grapes from this vineyard block were employed by Günter to great effect in the 1980s. Hand-harvested fruit was gently pressed and skin contact allowed for 12 hours to concentrate the aromatic flavours. With 22 g/l of residual sugar, the wine is rich, yet the sweetness is well tempered by the acidity, shows pronounced aromas of rose, lychee and pineapple.</i>	
<b>Château Guiraud - G de Guiraud – Bordeaux, France 2016</b>	40.00
<i>Rich and fruit driven with fresh aromas of stone fruit, lime and gooseberry. The palate is well balanced with pure and elegant acidity alongside a rich texture, perfect with fish and seafood dishes.</i>	
<b>Jean Biecher Gewürztraminer – Alsace, France</b>	32.00
<i>Geh-vuhrtz-tramin-ah is the Queen of aromatic varieties, perfumed with lychee and rose petal scent. Perfect with spicy food and even a hint of chilli, or for those who love something fragrant.</i>	
<b>Cline Cellars North Coast Viognier, Sonoma USA</b>	32.50
<i>Cline Cellars have produced an honest and expressive Viognier. Wonderfully fragrant with notes of stone fruits, jasmine and honeysuckle. The palate follows through with a richness of fruit including ripe peach and apricot. The finish is given finesse by the refreshing acidity.</i>	
<b>Spy Valley Sauvignon Blanc – Marlborough, New Zealand</b>	35.00
<i>Spy Valley's sauvignon offers a lovely, generous example of the classic Marlborough style. This is vibrant, dry and crisp with plenty of passionfruit and nectarine flavours. Bright and fresh, with aromas and flavours of citrus fruit, peach and gooseberry. A delicately balanced wine with a refreshing finish. A hugely enjoyable - and highly recommended - New Zealand sauvignon.</i>	
<b>Rieslingfreak No.4 Eden Valley Riesling, Australia</b>	36.50
<i>Pale straw in colour, with aromas of vibrant lemon and limes, sweet spice and almond blossom. The palate is full of lemons, grapefruit and apples.</i> <i>Young gun winemaker and Riesling 'freak' John Hughes has taken the industry by storm with his on-point and diverse range of Riesling wines. His first vintage was in 2009 with a single vineyard Clare Valley Riesling, after which John expanded to the Eden Valley and Polish Hill River.</i>	
<b>Weitgasse Grüner-Veltliner Mantlerhof – Kremstal, Austria</b>	33.50
<i>This superb-value Gruner Veltliner is full of apple peel, hazelnuts, tree resin and lemon aromas, with down-to-earth flavours of earthy minerality, and again apples and pear skin. It has a soft, smooth texture, light tannins and a refreshing finish.</i>	
<b>A2O Albarino – Galicia, Spain</b>	36.50
<i>Perhaps the world's greatest seafood wine. A clean and intensely fresh wine that exhibits all the typical characteristics of the Albariño grape variety. Ripe and aromatic, with overtones of peach, melon and honey, offset by a crisp tangy acidity that helps to balance the rich fruit flavours. A well-rounded wine with a long, mellow, honeyed finish.</i>	

<b>Spy Valley Pinot Gris – Marlborough, New Zealand</b>	36.00
<i>Classic Pinot Gris aromas of pear, melons and hints of exotic spices. Concentrated and rich with a long, harmonious finish. Bright fruit is complemented by subtle richness from the lees. An absolute gem!</i>	
<b>Las Moradas de San Martin Albillo Real – Madrid, Spain</b>	37.50
<i>Pale colour and aromas that reveals sweet notes of honey, pear, jasmine, and orange skin. Well-structured, silky, ending with a mineral and saline finish boosted by a light bitterness and a well-balanced acidity.</i>	
<b>Cloudy Bay Sauvignon Blanc Marlborough New Zealand</b>	65.00
<i>A wine full of fresh herbal aromas and layers of ripe guava and tropical fruit. Gooseberries and passion fruit on the medium-full body; the palate is succulent and crisp with a long flavoursome finish.</i>	
<b>Château Léoube, Blanc de Léoube AOC Côtes de Provence, France</b>	55.00
<i>The herb and mint notes that underly the spiced pear aromas evoke the maquis that surrounds the vines; and the gentle salinity that flows through the finish is a natural result of the breezes that blow off the sea. Textured and highly distinctive, this is an exciting dry white wine.</i>	
<b>Caparrone Pecorino, IGT Colline Pescaresi 2018, Abruzzo, Italy</b>	25.00
<i>Vibrant aromas of ripe stone fruit with citrus and grapefruit notes. The palate is crisp and zesty with layers of fresh peachy, tropical fruit characters. Ripe and approachable, with texture and minerality giving depth, and backed by lively acidity.</i>

<b>Terre Forti Trebbiano Chardonnay – Emilia Romagna, Italy</b>	19.00
<i>Aromas and flavours of apples and pears with some citrus fruit. A light white wine that is perfect for a glass at lunchtime or summer drinking.</i>	
<del><b>La Troubadour Ugni Blanc Colombard – Languedoc, France</b></del>	<del>20.00</del>
<del><i>A lively fresh and fruity wine with a heart of citrus fruit and a no-frills sensibility. A classic southern French white with crisp apple and pear flavours and note of peach on the finish. A real crowd pleaser.</i></del>	
<b>Conto Vecchio Pinot Grigio delle Venezie, Veneto, Italy</b>	22.50
<i>An inviting nose of fruits with delicate floral notes. Dry and crisp on the palate with an elegant, light body. Delicate pear and almond flavours wrapped in a soft mouth-feel.</i>	
<b>La Serre Sauvignon Blanc Vin de Pays d’Oc – Languedoc, France</b>	23.50
<i>Ripe and peachy, we just love this Southern French wonder and its sun-ripened fruit. Three words to describe it: crisp, clean and fresh. Intense nose with notes of toasty spice, lemons and crisp green apples. On the palate, the wine is soft and smooth with vanilla enriching the peachy, apple fruit. The finish is bright and refreshing.</i>	
<b>Podere dal Nespole Le Coste Trebbiano DOC – Emilia-Romagna, Italy</b>	20.00
<i>A light, fresh and fruity wine, with a pale yellow color and clear, with greenish reflections. It gives fruity hints of citrus fruits, such as lemon and cedar, and notes of green apple. In the mouth the same flavors are combined with a balanced acidity and a typical freshness of Trebbiano grown in this area.</i>	

- Marmora Vermentino di Sardegna DOC – Sardinia, Italy** 27.50  
*Known as Rolle in the south of France, this grape can lay claim to some pretty unexciting wines; cross the sea to Sardinia, planted on brutally poor soils, it morphs into Vermentino, and becomes another beast altogether. Here, fresh, salty sea breezes create peachy white fruits, soft and rounded, with a zip of salinity behind. Simply delicious.*
- Cuatro Rayas Verdejo Rueda – Rueda, Spain** 27.50  
*Clean, powerful and fresh on the nose, the palate is full of fruity, herbal flavours and a touch of fennel on the finish. Full flavoured and powerful, but well balanced with a silky texture and good length.*
- Mas Puech Picpoul de Pinet – Coteaux du Languedoc, France** 27.50  
*'Picpoul' means the 'lip-stinger' because of the grape's refreshing zestiness, coupled with a delicious ripe fruit. Superb color pale yellow with bright tints. Nose elegant, with aromas of fresh citrus fruits. The balance is zesty and harmonious with great varietal expression. A very fresh and crisp wine that goes really well with simple seafood dishes.*
- Touraine Sauvignon Blanc Les Nuages – Loire, France** 27.50  
*Sancerre for a fraction of the price! Lively Loire Sauvignon with classic minerality, lemon and lime fruit on the nose and palate. Crisp and dry with refreshing, seafood-friendly acidity on the finish.*
- Pinot Bianco Alto Adige Alois Lageder – Alto Adige, Italy** 35.00  
*White flowers, white fruit and a character as crisp and bright as the Dolomite mountains it hails from. Alois Lageder is an ultra-sustainable biodynamic estate established in 1823 and is a true pioneer of biodynamic principals in Italy.*
- Tomàs Cusiné Auzells – Catalunya, Spain** 40.00  
*The most beautiful label on our list heralds one of the most remarkable blends, with fruit, spice and amazing depth of flavour. a touch of beeswax, a touch of elderflower, and plenty of punch. On the palate there's a lovely mouth-filling sweet fruit. The layering of this wine is lovely, with mineral notes adding to the dry juiciness, but no shortage of sweet and ripe, rounded flavours persisting to the end.*
- Francis Blanchet Pouilly Fumé Calcite – Loire, France** 40.00  
*A racy little number, with aromas of bright white fruits and flowers bounding out of the glass. The mineral aspect of the wine (hence the 'calcite' name) is also apparent in the aroma. Imagine a limestone cliff after a rainstorm. Shy in its youth, it's obvious this wine is going to grow a bit in the next year or two, loosening up its tight hold on the aromatics. The flavour profile is dynamic, with the same energy as the first sip of a margarita after a five hour trek through a jungle .. your mouth simply wants. The finish comes to a point a few seconds after swallowing and just like Kevin Spacey in the final scene of The Usual Suspects just like that .... poof! ... it's gone. Awesome stuff.*
- Chablis Domaine des Maronniers, Bernard Legland – Burgundy, France** 45.00  
*Brilliant benchmark Chablis with clean, incisive Chardonnay fruit: green apples, hints of honey, lemon and limes, stony minerality and just a whisper of richness behind.*
- Sancerre Blanc Les Pierriers Domaine Thomas – Loire, France** 42.50  
*Focussed and precise with rapier-like fresh fruit and a food-loving minerality. Subtle hints of gooseberry and citrus are the hallmarks of this classic Loire Sauvignon. The palate is flinty and crisp with an elegantly long length.*



<b>Menetou-Salon, La Bardine, Joseph Mellot – Loire, France</b>	36.50
<i>The small appellation of Menetou-Salon, just under 500 hectares, is adjacent to Sancerre to the south-west, like its better-known neighbour, it too is planted with Sauvignon Blanc. Here, the vines are planted on Kimmeridgian limestone soils, very similar to those of Chablis, and similar mineral notes can be detected in the wines. Cool-fermented and unoaked, the wine shows fresh citrus fruit, such as grapefruit, green fruit and herbaceous nuances.</i>	
<b>2016 Riesling Grand Cru Wiebelsberg Marc Kreydenweiss Alsace</b>	85.00
<i>This Grand Cru Riesling comes exclusively from south-east facing slopes at the end of the Andlau Valley. This is floral &amp; elegant with spicy notes. A wonderfully balanced Riesling with bright aromas and flavors. On the nose, it recalls freshly cut apples, honey, white flowers and a bit of tea aroma. The palate is extraordinary, with slightly sweet and honeyed in texture but also enough acidity to create a lasting, mineral finish.</i>	
<b>‘Baron de L’ Ladoucette Pouilly-Fumé 2015 – Loire, France</b>	125.00
<i>A prestige cuvée produced exclusively in the best years, the ‘Baron de L’ is a Pouilly Fumé considered among the highest worldwide expressions of Sauvignon Blanc. Exceptional elegance and depth with lovely ripe pear flavours overlaying a firm gooseberry structure. The palate is dry and fresh, powerful and complex, with a very intriguing body.</i>	

## Fuller Bodied Whites

<b>Lorosco Reserva Chardonnay – Casablanca, Chile</b>	20.00
<i>A tropical tour de force, with pineapple freshness matched by peach fruitiness that complements this wine’s vanilla-scented oak. Try with richer-flavoured white meat dishes.</i>	
<b>Montagny 1<sup>er</sup> Cru Domaine Jean-Marc Boillot – Côte Chalonnaise, Burgundy, France</b>	55.00
<i>Shows a pale-yellow colour with bright reflections. The nose is very floral with aromas of honeysuckle and white hawthorn. Ample in the mouth, of a beautiful roundness, notes of white fruits appear with a peppery finish.</i>	
<b>Macon Villages Vignerons des Terres Secretes – Burgundy, France</b>	35.00
<i>Lusciously balanced and creamy Mâcon, singing with honeysuckle flowers, a beautiful food wine. World-famous Chardonnay is at home in the Maconnais region of Burgundy; it takes its name from an ancient village there. This is one very expressive wine: Bright and refreshing, but full and creamy in the mouth.</i>	
<b>Journeys End Haystack Chardonnay – Stellenbosch, South Africa</b>	32.50
<i>A big, rich, South African Chardonnay packed with ripe tropical fruit flavours and a buttery character, it has good acidity which stops this being cloying.</i>	
<b>Viré-Clessé Le Mont Chatelaine Jean Rijckaert, Maconnais, Burgundy</b>	40.00
<i>Full of minerality and aromatic expression with fantastic purity and definition. Pale colour. Aromas of yellow fruit, peach and citrus zest. Rich, elegant, medium bodied with a good length. This wine is just gorgeous it has density and a racy acidity.</i>	

<b>Dry Creek Vineyard Wilson Ranch Chenin Blanc – California, USA</b>	35.00
<i>The best Chenin from the USA bar none Aromas of honeysuckle, banana, orange peel and tropical fruit are evident. The palate is defined by vibrant flavours of green apple, citrus and melon that mingle with crisp acidity.</i>	
<b>‘Les Murelles’ Domaine Roux Bourgogne Chardonnay– Burgundy, France</b>	38.50
<i>Enjoy the seamless texture in this classic, creamy white Burgundy with keen mineral flavours and hazelnut oak.</i>	
<b>Nederburg The Anchorman Chenin Blanc, Western Cape, South Africa</b>	37.5
<i>Named after founder Philppus Wolvaart who first planted Chenin Blanc in the late 18th century at the Nederburg farm. The fruit was sourced from old, low-yielding, dry-land bush vines in Darling, Paarl and Durbanville.</i>	
<b>Domaine Jean Thomas St Veran, Côtes Mâconnaise, Burgundy, France</b>	45.00
<i>Situated in Prisse near Pouilly-Fuisse, where it has the same classic limey clay soils as its more famous neighbour. Aromas and flavours of citrus fruit, apple, white flowers and pear, with a good hint of creamy and nutty flavours too. An easy-drinking, refreshing wine.</i>	
<b>Rully Clos des Mollepierres Roux – Côte Chalonnaise, France</b>	50.00

*Aging has been extremely positive for this vintage. The colour has deepened and given way to more complex aromas. Fermented in open-topped tanks, the wine was matured in barrels, some French oak and none new, for about two years prior to bottling.
