Laurent-Perrier Blanc de Blancs Brut Nature, Champagne NV	125.00
Crisp and fresh with fuller notes of grapefruit. Waves of ripe white fruit and citrus with mineral hints.	
Bollinger La Grande Année Brut	150.00
Flavours of wild peach, plum and orange peel along with saffron. Fresh structure with a gentle saline finish.	
Dom Perignon Brut 2010	195.00
No assemblage of the finest Chardonnay and Pinot Noir grapes, the wine's opulence is revealed through its complex and edgy silky taste with solid and rich flavours of brioche, ripe pear and hazelnut.	

Whites - Light, Crisp & Fresh

- Terre Forti Trebbiano Chardonnay - Emilia Romagna, Italy** 22.50
Aromas & flavours of apples & pears with some citrus fruit. A light white wine that is perfect for a glass at lunchtime or summer drinking.
- La Serre Sauvignon Blanc Vin de Pays d'Oc - Languedoc, France** 25.00
Ripe & peachy, we just love this Southern French wonder & its sun-ripened fruit. Three words to describe it: crisp, clean and fresh. Intense nose with notes of toasty spice, lemons & crisp green apples. The wine is soft & smooth with vanilla enriching the peachy, apple fruit. The finish is bright and refreshing.
- Le Coq Perdú Vermentino, Pays d'Oc, Languedoc-Roussillon, France** 25.00
At home in the south of France, the Vermentino is producing a wine which is full of citrus, peach & apple flavours with a touch of almond blossom. So fresh & fruity - perfect for a sunny summer's afternoon.
- Conto Vecchio Pinot Grigio delle Venezie, Veneto, Italy** 25.00
An inviting nose of fruits with delicate floral notes. Dry and crisp on the palate with an elegant, light body. Delicate pear and almond flavours wrapped in a soft mouth-feel.
- Menetou-Salon, La Gardine, Joseph Mellot, Loire Valley, France** 35.00
The small appellation of Menetou-Salon, just under 500 hectares, is adjacent to Sancerre to the south-west; like its better-known neighbour, it too is planted with Sauvignon Blanc. Here, the vines are planted on Kimmeridgian limestone soils, very similar to those of Chablis, and similar mineral notes can be detected in the wines. Cool-fermented and unoaked, the wine shows fresh citrus fruit, such as grapefruit, green fruit and herbaceous nuances.
- Cuatro Rayas Verdejo Rueda - Rueda, Spain** 27.50
Clean, powerful and fresh on the nose, the palate is full of fruity, herbal flavours and a touch of fennel on the finish. Full flavoured and powerful, but well balanced with a silky texture and good length.
- Muscadet de Sèvre et Maine Sur Lie, Château du Cléray, Loire Valley, France** 27.50
One of the oldest estates in the heart of the Nantes vineyard region, the vineyards are planted in clay and sand soils over granite and schist bedrock. The palate shows a good minerality and a touch of richness, with citrus and apple fruit and notes of lime blossom and mint.
- Mas Quech Ricpoul de Ripet, Coteaux du Languedoc, France** 27.50
'Ricpoul' means the 'lip-stinger' because of the grape's refreshing zestiness, coupled with a delicious ripe fruit. Superb color pale yellow with bright tints. Nose elegant, with aromas of fresh citrus fruits. The balance is zesty and harmonious with great varietal expression. A very fresh and crisp wine that goes really well with simple seafood dishes.

- Touraine Sauvignon Blanc Les Nuages – Loire, France** **27.50**
 Sancerre for a fraction of the price! Lively Loire Sauvignon with classic minerality, lemon and lime fruit on the nose and palate. Crisp and dry with refreshing, seafood-friendly acidity on the finish.
- Pinot Bianco Alto Adige Alois Lageder – Alto Adige, Italy** **35.00**
 White flowers, white fruit and a character as crisp and bright as the Dolomite mountains it hails from. Alois Lageder is an ultra-sustainable biodynamic estate established in 1823 and is a true pioneer of biodynamic principals in Italy.
- Saint Véran Chapelle aux Loups, Louis Jadot, Mâconnais, Burgundy, France** **40.00**
 The vineyards of the Domaine de la Chapelle aux Loups surround the 12th-century Romanesque church after which they are named. Situated in the south-western corridor of the Saint Véran appellation near the cliffs of Solutré, the limestone soils of this domaine are ideal for making fine Chardonnay. Dry, delicate with floral and citrus aromas and marked hazelnut aromas, the wine is unoaked and has a fresh style.
- Francis Blanchet Pouilly Fumé Calcite – Loire, France** **42.50**
 Kracy little number, with aromas of bright white fruits and flowers bounding out of the glass. The mineral aspect of the wine (hence the 'calcite' name) is also apparent in the aroma. Imagine a lime stone cliff after a rain storm.
- Chablis Domaine Costal – Burgundy, France** **45.00**
 Brilliant benchmark Chablis with clean, incisive Chardonnay fruit: green apples, hints of honey, lemon and limes, stony minerality and just a whisper of richness behind.
- Sancerre Blanc Les Pierriers Domaine Thomas – Loire, France** **45.00**
 Focussed and precise with rapier-like fresh fruit and a food-loving minerality. Subtle hints of gooseberry and citrus are the hallmarks of this classic Loire Sauvignon. The palate is flinty and crisp with an elegantly long length.

Fruit Driven & Aromatic

- Vine Trail Gewürztraminer, Rapel Valley, Chile** 25.00
A dry Gewürztraminer, with just a touch of richness; well-balanced showing classic notes of orange blossom, lychee and rose followed by a fresh finish. Great with food that has a touch of spice or sweetness to it.
- Osado White Malbec, Mendoza, Argentina** 25.00
Much like its red counterpart Malbec grapes are hand-harvested but clusters were pressed softly at very low pressure so that the must did not take on any colour from the skin. It's very fresh on the nose, with aromas of red fruits, currants, strawberries and delicate notes of white flowers. It brings the elegance and freshness of white wine together with the strength and texture of the original grape variety. It's great length is due to its refreshing acidity.
- Marotti Campi Verdicchio dei Castelli di Jesi Classico Superiore Luzano, Marche, Italy** 25.00
Situating near the medieval village of Morro d'Alba on Italy's stunning Le Marche region, they focus on two indigenous varieties: Lacrima and Verdicchio. Aromas of acacia, wildflowers, chamomile and almonds. Dry and savoury, with a pleasant crisp finish.
- Spyn Valley Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, New Zealand** 35.00
Bright and fresh, with aromas and flavours of citrus fruit, peach and gooseberry. A delicately balanced wine with a refreshing finish.
- Jean Biecher Pinot Blanc - Alsace, France** 27.50
The forgotten Pinot, and undeservedly so. Soft, lightly peachy and fresh with delicate white flowers, this Alsace Pinot Blanc is beautifully food-friendly and subtle.
- Virgen de Galir Maruxa Godello, Valdeorras, Galicia, Spain** 29.50
The 20 hectare Virgen de Galir winery in Galicia takes advantage of the schist soils in the valley of the Galir river. At almost 600m altitude the advantage of temperature difference between day and night add to the freshness of this wine. On the nose its intense with white fruit and heaps of minerality. Balanced, fresh and persistent on the palate
- Marmora Vermentino di Sardegna DOC - Sardinia, Italy** 27.50
Known as Rolle in the south of France, this grape can lay claim to some pretty unexciting wines; cross the sea to Sardinia, planted on brutally poor soils, it morphs into Vermentino, and becomes another beast altogether. Here, fresh, salty sea breezes create peachy white fruits, soft and rounded, with a zip of salinity behind. Simply delicious.

Riesling Jean Biecher, Alsace, France	27.50
This dry white wine is characterised by an intense freshness. It has aromas and flavours of citrus fruit, intertwined with more tropical fruit notes of peach and melon. A medium-bodied wine, with a rich and creamy texture.	
Nederburg The Beautiful Lady Gewürztraminer, Stellenbosch, South Africa	35.00
The wine takes its name from a description of Ilse Graue, the wife of wine maker Johann Graue, for the gracious sense of hospitality, she brought to Nederburg. Hand-harvested fruit has skin contact for 12 hours to concentrate the aromatic flavours. With 22 g/l of residual sugar, the wine is rich, yet the sweetness is well tempered by the acidity; shows pronounced aromas of rose, lychee and pineapple.	
Gavi di Gavi DOCG, Enrico Serafino, Piedmont, Italy	35.00
The Cortese grapes are sourced from the best vineyards around the town of Gavi to the north of Genoa. Unoaked, the wine spends a little time on its lees to develop a richer mouth-feel. Showing floral and citrus aromas, with a minerally, dry palate.	
Zuccardi Serie A Torrontes, Mendoza, Argentina	37.50
Intense yellow colour with silver hues. A delicate and intense nose, full of white flowers and citric fruits. Notes of orange peel and oregano. This wine is well structured and has lively acidity and very aromatic. A delicate but long finish.	
Klois Lageder Rorer Pinot Grigio 2018, Trentino-Alto Adige, Italy	42.50
Klois Lageder is an ultra-sustainable biodynamic estate established in 1823 and is a true pioneer of biodynamic principals in Italy. Rich in body with a lot of tension. Fresh and fruity with melon and peach flavours, and a touch of spice and minerality.	
Cline Cellars North Coast Viognier, Sonoma County, USA	33.50
Cline Cellars have produced an honest and expressive Viognier. Wonderfully fragrant with notes of stone fruits, jasmine, and honeysuckle. The palate follows through with a richness of fruit including ripe peach and apricot. The finish is given finesse by the refreshing acidity.	
Weitgasse Grüner-Veltliner Mantlerhof – Kremstal, Austria	35.00
This superb-value Grüner Veltliner is full of apple peel, hazelnuts, tree resin and lemon aromas, with down-to-earth flavours of earthy minerality, and again apples and pear skin. It has a soft, smooth texture, light tannins, and a refreshing finish.	
R20 Albarino – Galicia, Spain	35.00
Perhaps the world's greatest seafood wine. A clean and intensely fresh wine that exhibits all the typical characteristics of the Albariño grape variety. Ripe and aromatic, with overtones of peach, melon and honey, offset by a crisp tangy acidity that helps to balance the rich fruit flavours. A well-rounded wine with a long, mellow, honeyed finish.	

Spv Valley Pinot Gris – Marlborough, New Zealand	37.50
Classic Pinot Gris aromas of pear, melons and hints of exotic spices. Concentrated and rich with a long, harmonious finish. Bright fruit is complemented by subtle richness from the lees. An absolute gem!	
Las Moradas de San Martin Albillo Real – Madrid, Spain	40.00
Pale colour and aromas that reveals sweet notes of honey, pear, jasmine, and orange skin. Well-structured, silky, ending with a mineral and saline finish boosted by a light bitterness and a well-balanced acidity.	
Cloudy Bay Sauvignon Blanc Marlborough New Zealand	65.00
A wine full of fresh herbal aromas and layers of ripe guava and tropical fruit. Gooseberries and passion fruit on the medium-full body; the palate is succulent and crisp with a long flavoursome finish.	
Château Léoube, Blanc de Léoube AOC Côtes de Provence, France	55.00
The herb and mint notes that underly the spiced pear aromas evoke the maquis that surrounds the vines; and the gentle salinity that flows through the finish is a natural result of the breezes that blow off the sea. Textured and highly distinctive, this is an exciting dry white wine.	
Jean Biecher Gewürztraminer – Alsace, France	35.00
Gewürztraminer is the Queen of aromatic varieties, perfumed with lychee and rose petal scent. Perfect with spicy food and even a hint of chilli, or for those who love something fragrant.	
Caparrone Pecorino, IGT Colline Pescaresi 2018, Abruzzo, Italy	29.50
Vibrant aromas of ripe stone fruit with citrus and grapefruit notes. The palate is crisp and zesty with layers of fresh peachy, tropical fruit characters. Ripe and approachable, with texture and minerality giving depth, and backed by lively acidity.	
Bulgarini Lugana DOC, Veneto, Italy	35.00
This wine has flavours of peach and apricot. It has a good structure and a long, slightly almond-edged finish. Hand harvesting is carried out across their 50 ha of vineyards with a precise selection of the best grapes occurring in the winery. The drying, aging and maturation processes are completed in wooden barrels, and their Lugana DOC spends extended time on the lees to balance the apricot and peachy fruit palate.	
Tomas Cusiné Ruzells, Costers del Segre, Catalunya, Spain	35.00
A very bright green and gold colour, this unique modern Spanish wine has a wide range of aromas, including apples, pears, mangos, apricots, orange flowers, citric notes, green grass, and aromatic herbs like rosemary. Macabeo, Riesling, Sauvignon Blanc, Albariño and Chardonnay make up this slightly bonkers but delicious blend!	

Crozes-Hermitage Blanc, Les Gravières, Jean-Luc Colombo, Northern Rhône, France **45.00**

Equal quantities of Marsanne and Roussanne make up the blend, the grapes were mainly harvested from the steep granitic slopes around the commune of Gervan, about half of which is aged in a mixture of new and one-year-old oak barrels. Harmonious in the mouth with an aromatic profile, it shows notes of white flowers, candied lemon and a fresh minerality.

Château Olivier Pessac-Léognan Grand Cru Classé Blanc, Bordeaux, France **75.00**

Following the classification of the estate in 1953, for both red and white, Château Olivier's vineyards have seen considerable work and investment in the last few years, resulting in more concentrated wines.

Fermented in barrels and aged for 12 months on its lees. Citrus, pineapple and stone fruits aromas with mineral notes. Fully ripe on the palate with herbal notes and a long lingering finish. A super example of an old-world Sauvignon/Semillon blend.

Fuller Bodied

Montagny Pierres Blanche, Côte Chalonnaise, Burgundy, France 35.00

Shows a pale-yellow colour with bright reflections. The nose is very floral with aromas of honeysuckle and white hawthorn.AMPLE in the mouth, of a beautiful roundness, notes of white fruits appear with a peppery finish.

Macon Villages Vignerons des Terres Secretes – Burgundy, France 35.00

Lusciously balanced and creamy Mâcon, singing with honeysuckle flowers, a beautiful food wine. World-famous Chardonnay is at home in the Maconnais region of Burgundy; it takes its name from an ancient village there. This is one very expressive wine: Bright and refreshing, but full and creamy in the mouth.

Spier Signature Chenin Blanc, Stellenbosch, South Africa, 2019 30.00

Spier's Signature Chenin Blanc is a crisp, unoaked style Chenin, packed with tropical fruits. The grapes for Spier's Chenin Blanc were hand-picked from selected blocks in the Coastal and Breede River region of the Western Cape. It was matured for 3 months on its lees to give extra body and elegance. The wine was not oaked.

Givry Blanc, Remoissenet Père & Fils, Côte Chalonnaise, Burgundy, France 45.00

The white wines of Givry make up about 15% of the appellation's output. After a particularly late harvest, and slow yet quite warm fermentation, the wine is aged in French oak barrels, 25% new, for about a year prior to bottling. Shows bright aromas with notes of lemon, lime, lily and hints of honey on toast. The mouth is relatively delicate, balanced between mellow and fresh.

Rully Clos des Mollepierres Roûx – Côte Chalonnaise, France 55.00

The Estate-owned vineyard of Clos Des Mollepierres was aptly named "field of soft stones" for its unique soil composition. This well-rounded, vibrant wine possesses rich fruit flavors. Floral aromas abound on the nose with accents of citrus and stone fruit notes. Honey and dried fruit flavors develop in time. Fermented on the lees and aged in French oak barrels for several months.

Meiomi Chardonnay, Monterey-Sonoma-Santa Barbara, California, USA 40.00

Blend of 100% Chardonnay grapes from three distinct vineyard regions, with about a third each coming from Monterey, Sonoma and Santa Barbara. The Monterey fruit contributing ripe stone fruit and a creamy character, the Sonoma grapes bringing crisp apple and a lean minerality and the Santa Barbara grapes bring exotic sweet spice and lively tropical fruit flavours to the blend. Bright, layered with tropical and stone fruit mixing with notes of honey and butterscotch.

Saint-Rubin, Louis Jadot, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy, France 70.00

The commune of Saint Rubin lies at the western fringe of the Côte de Beaune overlooking Rully, Auxey-Duresses, Meursault, Puligny-Montrachet, Chassagne-Montrachet and Santenay. touches of soft peachy fruit and a delicate nutty rounded character on the long-balanced finish.

- Roilly Fuisse La Croix Vieilles Vignes Denogent, Mâconnais, Burgundy, France** 70.00
Utter loveliness. Top-flight white Burgundy from a great small producer who regularly sells out. This family winery is all about minimalism. No chemicals, no synthetics, just years of winemaking heritage in each bottle.
- Jordan Russian River Valley Chardonnay – Sonoma County California, USA** 75.00
Refined aromas of green apple, pear and lemon peel with a flinty note. Its elegant palate echoes the bouquet with bright flavours of stone fruit and citrus, backed by firm acidity. A touch of creaminess on the mid-palate is followed by lovely mineral notes carrying a long finish. It would be difficult to distinguish this bottle as California against a line-up of White Burgundies.
- Chassagne-Montrachet 1^{er} Cru Macherelles Domaine Roux Burgundy, France** 105.00
At first glance, this is a quiet, green-flecked wine with hints of bacon fat and sharp apples, basil and nutmeg. But with time, there is more depth on the nose, turning brûlée and stone fruit, richer and broader. Focused on the start and on the finish, but opening a little and softening out – briefly – in the middle. Another lovely pepper-spiked finish for these Roux wines.
- Ruligny-Montrachet, Louis Jadot, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy, France** 125.00
Ruligny-Montrachet, situated to the south of Meursault and to the north of Chassagne-Montrachet, shares with Chassagne a handful of the greatest white wine vineyards in the world. Straw yellow in colour, aromas of stone fruit, lemon peel & melon. Elegantly fresh and a touch creamy on the palate.
- Chablis 1er Cru 'Les Vaillons' Domaine Jean Defaix** 55.00
This premier cru is rich with mineral, apple and melon flavours and the waxy texture combined with balanced acidity which shows us how good Chablis can be. The bouquet has a striking smoky, mineral character. The palate shows high acidity, plenty of mineral complexity and a touch of honey. A rich, full style with good acidity.
- 2015 Chablis Grand Cru Blanchot Louis Jadot** 95.00
The palate is very well balanced, quite lush in the mouth, with subtle tropical tones that become more obvious toward the peachy, passion fruit finish. It might lack tension and terroir and is a furlong behind the Les Preuses and Vaudésir, but it is undeniably delicious.
- 2014 Bâtard-Montrachet Grand Cru Louis Jadot** 325.00
This is a major wine from a great white wine vintage that's naturally impressive and intense. Ripe white and yellow fruit dominates the palate, sustained by wood aging flavours and tight, nervy texture. Bâtard-Montrachet is largest of the five white Grand Crus in Ruligny and Chassagne Montrachet.

Red - Light & Fruity

- Bardolino Classico, Bolla, Veneto, Italy** 25.00
From vineyards on the shores of Lake Garda, close to Verona. Made using the traditional mix of Corvina, Rondinella and Molinara grapes, cool-fermented to conserve the maximum fruit flavours and aromas, typically light-bodied with a fresh, fruity character.
- Terre di Giomara Frappato Nerello Mascalese IGT - Sicily, Italy** 26.50
IGP Terre Siciliane, from Trapani, and a 50/50 blend of Frappato and Nerello Mascalese. Wow - soaring perfume, but quite a bit of it seems to be charry oak, melding with the exoticism of the Frappato, but perhaps just a touch resinous and dominated by the oak. Sumptuous and rich stuff, so much coffee and substance here, the ripeness and sweetness is undeniably lovely.
- La Troubadour Carignan Grenache - Languedoc, France** 20.00
A real star of the show, bags of fun!! A soft, smooth, and plummy red with just a hint of spice. This has a wonderfully light-bodied texture, but ripe and juicy fruit.
- Les Nuages Pinot Noir - Loire, France** 25.00
A light, fresh and elegant Pinot Noir, almost like a dark rose that is perfect with salads and lighter dishes.
- Marmora Cannonau di Sardegna - Sardinia, Italy** 27.50
Cannonau is the grape-jewel of Sardinia, known for its sunny raspberry and strawberry fruit. It's a lush, rich wine without being dense, great for heartier dishes and lots of slow-cooked tomato sauce.
- Le Versant Pinot Noir - Languedoc, France** 29.50
The most versatile wine on our list, if in doubt, this fruity, ripe and juicy Pinot is a great choice and universally popular. With its teasing raspberry scents and light, fresh, elegant palate is a success. It's not too dry or too strong, nor does it have a bitter finish - the usual hazards here. Delicate, tender and true.
- Fleurie Millesime Cave de Fleurie - Beaujolais, France** 32.50
Fresh, attractive, and bright with clean fruit flavours - archetypal Beaujolais, in other words. A striking and vivid red colour with several punnets' worth of red berry fruit on the nose and palate. Soft and fresh with light ripe tannins and crisp acidity.
- Meiomi Pinot Noir - California, USA** 40.00
Stunning Pinot Noir blending grapes from three top Coastal Californian Appellations - Sonoma, Monterey, and Santa Barbara. Lifted aromas of bright strawberry, mocha, and vanilla, with toasty oak notes.
- Morgon Marcel Lapierre - Beaujolais - France** 55.00
One of my absolute favourites! Superb depth of fruit and freshness with ripe tannins. Fruit-forward finish. Bursting with cherry, liquorice & violet, this is an extremely fresh and exciting Morgon style, and without a doubt one of the best in the region.

Fixin, Louis Jadot, Côte De Nuits, Burgundy, France	60.00
<p>Located just to the south of Dijon, Fixin is one of the most northerly communes in the Côte de Nuits. Its gentle slopes face due east and the soils are limestone containing a few traces of marl. Fermented in vats for about 4 weeks, the wine is then put into oak barrels for 15 months ageing before bottling.</p>	
Domaine Roux Santenay 1er Cru Clos Rousseau, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy, France	60.00
<p>A dense, bright, dark red with delicious fruit on the nose, this is very classy. The nose is multi-layered with real density. No undue weight. Very succulent; a winner this year.</p>	
Jean Châtenet Nuits Saint Georges 2017 - Côte De Nuits, Burgundy, France	75.00
<p>Classic Pinot Noir fruit aroma, with excellent weight and real structure on the palate along with flavours of cherry, liquorice and balsamic.</p>	
Prophet's Rock Home Vineyard Pinot Noir, Central Otago, New Zealand	75.00
<p>One of New Zealand's most exciting producers, creating premium, artisan wines in Central Otago, with winemaker Raúl Pujol at the helm.</p> <p>Rich ruby in colour, with red berry fruit, spice and floral aromas on the nose. An elegant, well structured, mineral-driven palate with rich aromatics and silky tannins. This wine will reward cellaring over the next 6-10 or more years from vintage.</p>	
Rommard, Bouchard Père & Fils, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy, France	85.00
<p>The Rommard appellation extends over 188 hectares and is devoted solely to red wines, Rommard wines are firm with a lot of colour and a vivid bouquet. This powerful and robust example has flavours of cherries, oak and spices, a well-constituted structure and mellow tannins. Vinification takes place in oak vats, this is followed by barrel maturation for 14 to 16 months in oak barrels with about 20% being new.</p>	
Gevrey Chambertin Domaine Roux, Côte de Nuits, Burgundy, France	75.00
<p>Notes of wild strawberry, violet, and rose on the nose. This is a structured Gevrey with velvety tannins and well-judged oak. The palate evokes black cherry and licorice.</p>	
2007 Gevrey-Chambertin 1er Cru Petite Chapelle, Louis Jadot, Côte de Nuits, Burgundy, France	135.00
<p>The small vineyard of Petite Chapelle is situated at the south of the village, close to the Grands Crus of Chapelle Chambertin. The fermentation takes place in vats for about four weeks and the wine is aged for up to 20 months in French oak barrels before bottling. Petite Chapelle is well coloured with a powerful tannin structure; strong but finely flavoured and quite close in style to the Grand Cru Chapelle.</p>	
Morey-St-Denis 1er Cru Les Chaffots Domaine Michel Magnien 2010, Côte de Nuits, Burgundy, France	125.00
<p>Morey-Saint-Denis is in Burgundy's Côte de Nuits between Gevrey-Chambertin to its north and Chambolle-Musigny to its south. This organically made red is all about sensory seduction and will floor you with its subtle aromas. The wine is centred around its core of spicy fruit that's supple with medium bodied flavours. As with much lauded Burgundy it's structured and concentrated on a complex finish.</p>	

Beaune Marconnets 1er Cru, Remoissenet Père & Fils, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy, France 95.00

The most northerly of Beaune's Premier Cru vineyards, Marconnets shows the intensity and power that one might expect from a wine from this end of the appellation. After a three week fermentation in traditional wooden vats the wine is aged in French oak barrels, about a third new, for 18 months. It has an intense high-toned nose which shows ripe red fruits and notes of smoke. The palate shows depth with blackcurrant and blackberry fruit and notes of truffle and leather.

Vosne Romanee Les Suchots, 2009, Jerome Chezeaux, Burgundy, France 150.00

The 2009 Vosne-Romanee Les Suchots is a totally complete, harmonious wine imbued with the essence of dark fruit, sweet spices, menthol and leather, all of which are supported by a firm vein of minerality. Intensely perfumed and mineral through to the finish, the Suchots delivers incredible class and sheer pedigree. The round, harmonious finish completes the wine beautifully

Corton-Rougets Grand Cru, Domaine des Héritiers, Louis Jadot, Côte de Beaune, Burgundy, France 125.00

The Grand Cru vineyard of Les Rougets is made up of two parcels covering ten hectares on the upper- and mid- slope directly adjacent to the Le Charlemagne 'climat'. Louis Jadot owns a superb, southerly-exposed parcel of about 1.5 hectares purchased in 1914. This exceptional site yields a complex, sumptuous wine which is powerfully structured and richly fruited. The aromatic Pinot Noir bouquet and deep, layered berry and oak flavours culminate in a seductive, persistent finish.

Soft & Rounded

- Cave de Massé Merlot-Carignan Red, Vin de France** 22.50
Soft, fruity, nicely balanced modern red from one of the leading produces in the south-west of France.
- Alto Bajo Merlot – Valle Central, Chile** 24.00
Merlot is an old French word for 'blackbird', so-called because they love these sweet, soft, plummy grapes when they are ripe and ready to make wines like this.
- Finea la Estacada Tempranillo 6 Mesas En Barrica D.O. – Ucles, Spain** 25.00
Elegant Rioja style from the heart of Spain. This is a ripe and juicy Tempranillo from the land of Don Quixote with lovely cream and spice notes from oak ageing. Perfect with lamb.
- Le Coq Perdú Malbec, Pays d'Oc, Langue doc-Roussillon** 25.00
The french are reclaiming this varetial with a style that is bursting with blackberry and violet with a touch a spicy oak.
- Bottega Merlot, Trevenize, Veneto, Italy** 25.00
From Veneto's old Trevenezie region, full of dark fruits such as blackcurrant, blackberries and black cherries. The wine is full bodied with velvety tannins and delicate herbal notes on the finish.
- Riva Leone Barbera – Piedmont, Italy** 25.00
Dark berry fruits with a core of fine tannins and the typical Barbera acidity that makes these wines so perfect to accompany big hearty autumn meals - perfect with any pasta dish, pheasant and game
- Drifting Merlot, Lodi, California, USA** 27.50
Drifting often leads to something great. This is what happened when Steve M. Winemaker for Drifting Wines sauntered into the rich, sandy loam soils in Lodi. Such is the case when aromas and flavours of raspberry, cherry and mocha tantalize your senses and fill your mouth with silky, soft tannins, followed by a sweetness balanced with with an oaky vanilla finish.
- Strofilia Mountain Fish Agiorgitiko Dry Red, Peloponnese, Greece** 27.50
Agiorgitiko grapes from vineyards in mountainous Nemea, close to the Greek mainland. A cool temperature controlled fermentation results in a wine that is fresh and aromatic. The nose shows notes of wild cherry and red fruits, whilst the palate is smooth, aromatic with a velvety finish punctuated by clove and vanilla spice. Named after the 'mountain fish' that live in the stream that flows past the vineyards.
- Gustavete el Mudo Monastrell, Alicante, Valencia, Spain** 29.50
The Monastrell grape variety is perhaps best known as Mourvèdre due to it being a component of many a Châteauneuf-du-Pape. It has been farmed in Spanish vineyards for over 500 years, particularly close to the east coast. This rich, fruit-driven example shows the grapes typical savoury, red fruit flavours.

- Château Gardégan Bordeaux Superior – Bordeaux, France** **33.50**
 When Sir Nicholas Soames talked about a 'breakfast claret' it was probably something like this bright, curranty Bordeaux, perfect with lighter game dishes and simple steaks. Just enough spice and a lovely, light grip on the palate
- Protos Ribera Del Duero Crianza 2016 Castilla y Leon** **35.00**
 Cherry colour with garnet rim, bright and intense. On the nose, there are aromas of red fruit, cocoa bean, creamy oak alongside hints of spices. The palate is powerful and fruity with good acidity and...
- St Cosme Côtes du Rhône– Rhone, France** **35.00**
 This is perfect Cotes du Rhone from the best producer in the Northern Rhone – spiced, minerally and dense. Flavours of graphite, strawberry compote, and lilacs. The nose is incredibly complex, with notes of forest fruits and mint.
- Château du Seuil Organic, Graves Rouge, Bordeaux, France** **37.50**
 The most successful wine from Château du Seuil and a long-standing favourite on our list. A blend of about 50% Cabernet Sauvignon and 50% Merlot, some of which undergoes a primary fermentation in barrel, along with pre- and post-fermentation skin contact and lees-stirring. The wine is aged for about 18 months in French oak barrels of which 30% is new. A elegant and concentrated, fruity wine with integrated oak flavours and firm, rounded tannins.
- Château Lyonnat, Lussac-Saint-Émilion, Bordeaux, France** **35.00**
 Gérard Milhade's principal château and one noted for producing wines of outstanding quality. The blend is 85% Merlot, 11% Cabernet Sauvignon and 4% Cabernet Franc. The estate includes some parcels of old vines and the hillside vineyards are situated on limestone and clay soils. Deep garnet with a warm spiced bread and red fruit character, powerful, yet supple, with vanilla aromas on the finish.
- Tomàs Cusiné Vilosell – Catalunya, Spain** **37.50**
 A deeply coloured, powerful mix of tempranillo and syrah made by top Spanish winemaker Tomàs Cusiné from his vineyards in Catalunya. Brimming with blueberry-fruit flavour supported by a pleasingly chunky backbone. A wine almost perfectly crafted for game dishes with sweet liquorice and spice in a complex and slightly bonkers blend of grapes.
- Château Lamothe-Cissac, Haut-Médoc, Bordeaux, France** **37.50**
 A excellent château, owned by the Fabre family, situated between Pauillac and Saint-Estèphe. The blend is typical for the region usually 75% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot and 5% Petit Verdot. Traditionally vinified and aged in oak barriques, 20% of which are new. Fine, aromatic, with a ripe cherry character enlivened by liquorice and vanilla.

Chianti Classico Riserva, Bottega, Tuscany, Italy	40.00
<p>Fine but complex and intense bouquet, starting with floral notes (mainly violet), developing into ripe fruity and vanilla bean notes, to finish with balsamic notes and hints of liquorice.</p> <p>Captivating, soft and velvety, it is soft and elegant on the palate, rich in noble tannins, with a pleasant final smoothness.</p>	
La Croix Bonis de Château Phélan Ségur St-Estèphe – Bordeaux, France	55.00
<p>Compelling and rich, a deeply satisfying, firm red from Bordeaux that makes lamb dishes sing. This wine is classic St Estèphe with rich, blackcurrant fruit on top of a deeply satisfying tannin structure.</p>	
Fleur de Pédesclaux, Pauillac, Bordeaux, France	55.00
<p>The second wine of Château Pédesclaux, which uniquely for Pauillac, is made from a 100% Merlot. The hand-harvested grapes undergo a long cold maceration of eight weeks and punching down of the cap is regularly carried out during fermentation. The wine is aged for about 16 months in 60% new and 40% one-year-old barrels. Unsurprisingly, it has a supple palate with integrated tannins, it shows red and black fruits with a note of cocoa.</p>	
2014 Blason de l'Évangile, Pomerol	90.00
<p>This is a classic Pomerol from the Lafite stable: a second wine that offers fantastic value for money. There's plush merlot fruit, with spice and a silky tannic backbone offering support. A wine to buy every year, you overlook the 2014 Blason at your peril.</p>	
Château Clarke (Listrac-Médoc), Bordeaux, France	75.00
<p>The first wine of Edmond de Rothschild, Château Clarke epitomises the attention to detail shown in all they do. Merlot-led, the silky tannins, perfect structure and decadent complexity make this a must-try Bordeaux.</p>	
2010 Château Kirwan 3ème Cru Classé, Margaux, France	125.00
<p>As always, this estate has produced a blockbuster style of Margaux in 2010, with the more masculine side of the appellation providing density, power, big body, loads of fruit, extract and richness. This wine is powerful and concentrated, but by no means excessively extracted. Dense purple, muscular, deep and impressive, it is a wine that allows for no compromise among wine lovers.</p>	
2010 Château Lagrange 3ème Grand Cru Classé, St Julien, France	125.00
<p>The historic Château Lagrange currently work with the renowned Eric Boissenot with the aim to produce what they call "the best wines in the world". They've certainly done well with this St Julien. It expresses ripe blueberry and blackcurrant flavours, with earthy aromas of leather and tobacco from ageing. It's smooth, yet intense on the palate with a great length. Decant for an hour before serving at room temperature with lamb.</p>	
2005 Château Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande 2^{ème} Cru Classé, Pauillac, France	275.00
<p>Rounded, immediately more graceful than the Reserve de Comtesse, with a certain minerality and earthiness. Solid, ripe black fruit, which is weighty on the palate and nicely juicy with a certain tension between the taut, supple tannins and sexy damson and black chocolate fruit quality. Very silky, delicious and long.</p>	

2001 Château Rauzan-Ségla, 2^{ème} Cru Classe Margaux, France **150.00**

The 2001 vintage is dense with a concentrated cassis nose, supported by graceful fruit and ripe tannins. Despite its power this has real class, showing elegance, restraint, and subtlety. This has all the majesty of great Margaux.

Tight, pure, very expressive black fruit that is focused and sharp with sweet floral nuances, cassis and a crisp minerality. Very sweet, creamy, dense, and ripe. Lots of purity here. Crisp, chewy tannins, this is long and harmonious.

2007 Château L'Église-Clinet, Pomerol **200.00**

Unquestionably the Pomerol of the vintage, the dense purple-colored 2007 L'Église-Clinet offers an astonishing display of rich, licorice and caramel-infused kirsch, black raspberry, and cassis fruit. Rich, full-bodied, and pure, with low acidity and ripe tannin, it is already offering delicious drinking, and should continue to do so for 15-20 years. Having just had the 1997, which is not as strong a wine as this 2007, that wine, from a very mediocre vintage, is still young. Kudos to proprietor Denis Duranton. Drink 2010-2030.

2014 Castello di Ama L'Apparita Toscana IGT, Tuscany, Italy **195.00**

100% Merlot Deep, impenetrable crimson with violet nuances, red berries, blackberries; spice reminiscent of vanilla, black peppercorns, and juniper. A balsamic note completes the aromatic profile of this wine. Extremely stylish, velvety and mouthfilling, yet powerful, with silky, delicate tannins. Decidedly fresh-tasting, endlessly lingering.

Ama had a 'Judgement of Paris' moment on 8 February 1992 when the L'Apparita 1987 vintage beat Rétrús 1988, Le Pin and 16 other world-class Merlot wines at a tasting hosted by the Académie du Vin in Switzerland, with a jury comprised of renowned winemaking consultant Michel Rolland.

Big, Bold & Spicy

- La Serre Syrah Vin de Pays d'Oc – Languedoc, France** 25.00
Dark, smooth and juicy, we love the blackberries in this wine mixed with a light, sun-ripened spice.
- Lorosco Reserva Colchagua Carmenère – Central Valley, Chile** 25.00
Love merlot? You will be a sucker for Carmenère, its redcurrant-scented cousin, found almost entirely in Chile. Lightly spiced with a hint of leafy freshness, this is a mid-weight and versatile red.
- Bodegas Arraez Vividor, Utiel-Requena, Valencia, Spain** 27.50
Named after Martin Lobo El Vividor, this is described as the most Thug wine of the Arraez range. 100% Bobal and with 4 months in America and French Oak, it has an intense garnet colour with aromas of fresh red berries and floral and balsamic notes. Rounded palate with lots of structure and a long finish.
- Woodbridge by Robert Mondavi Cabernet Sauvignon, California** 27.50
A blend of 85% Cabernet Sauvignon with 15% of other varieties, mostly Shiraz and Merlot, employed to add complexity and balance to the palate, some ageing in French and American oak barrels also adds to the flavour spectrum. Appealing red and dark berry fruit character reminiscent of cherry and currant, backed by warm vanilla tones on a long smooth finish.
- Les Hipsters Barbe, Côtes du Bourg, Bordeaux Right Bank, France** 27.50
Constructed from 80% Merlot, 10% Cabernet Sauvignon and 10% Malbec, the grapes grown on vines planted on chalky-clay soils overlooking the Gironde. The fermentation is slow and wine aged in French oak, 10% new, for a year. Shows aromas of ripe dark fruit with notes of broom flowers, coconut and brioche, the palate develops savoury blackcurrant flavours.
- Tilia Malbec - Mendoza, Argentina** 27.50
Presents a dark purple color with violet highlights. The nose offers bright black cherry aromas with light floral notes and a touch of toast. The mouthfeel is full and rich, with ripe, concentrated cassis and black raspberry fruit flavors interwoven with a touch of chocolate and sweet spice from light oak aging. This finish shows ripe, silky tannins
- JJ Hahn Homestead Stelzer Road Merlot, Barossa Valley, South Australia** 32.50
This Merlot is a rich deep purple colour, indicative of the variety, the nose displays welcoming hints of stewed plum, perfumed violet, cinnamon and cassis. The varietal stewed plum, and blackcurrant fill the mouth evenly, with hints of spice such as clove and cinnamon adding interest and complexity. The long persistence of flavour on the finish is supported by the velvety tannins and a fine line of drying acid, giving texture to the palate. The wine is matured in a mixture of French and American oak and a small percentage of Cabernet Sauvignon features in the blend.

- Nederburg The Brewmaster Cabernet Sauvignon, Western Cape, South Africa** **35.00**
 The blend is based on Cabernet Sauvignon (81%) with Merlot (9%), Malbec (6%) and Petit Verdot (4%) adding complexity to the finished wine. The components of the finished wine were aged for up to two years in French oak barrels prior to blending. Concentrated aromas of dark fruit, blackcurrant and cigar box are backed by a full-bodied palate with juicy fruit and savoury notes.
- Château du Breuil, Haut-Médoc, Cru Bourgeois, Bordeaux, France** **37.50**
 Strong expressions of fresh cedar and aromas of juicy black fruits giving a fresh nose to this Haut-Médoc. The first impression on the palate is straight, then pulpy with strong, well extracted and mature tannins. This wine is opulent and charismatic. Established in the 6th century, the Baronnie du Breuil is the oldest vineyard in the Médoc region. The blend is 54% Merlot, 43% Cabernet Sauvignon and 3% Petit Verdot.
- Catena Appellation Malbec – Mendoza, Argentina** **40.00**
 One of the world's great wines, Catena's concentrated, perfumed, fresh Malbec sets the Argentine standard. Flavours and aromas of plums, dark chocolate and blackberries, with notes of spice and pepper.
- Little Eden Shiraz Cabernet** **26.50**
 Deep ruby with raspberry jam, hints of mint and pepper finish. Spicy aroma character with vanilla notes. A soft velvety finish. Ideal with lamb, blue cheese or even baked figs.
- Lafite Rothschild Grande Reserve Los Vascos Cabernet/Carménère – Chile** **45.00**
 Expressive nose with fruity aromas of ripe cherry, pomegranate, and prunes, followed by notes of liquorice, caramel and walnut skin. Excellent volume, mouth-filling structure, and persistent tannins.
- Dinastia Vivanco Rioja Reserva – Rioja, Spain** **47.50**
 Mature black and red fruit; plum, cherry and damson with some balsamic and eucalyptus notes. This wine has intensity and balance, soft, round tannins, and a long finish with hints of toast and liquorice. Rioja lovers will not be let down.
- Barbaresco, Enrico Serafino, Piedmont, Italy** **47.50**
 The village of Barbaresco, two miles north-east of Alba, stands on a ridge overlooking some of the best vineyards in Piemonte; here the Nebbiolo grape makes well-structured wines with velvety palates. Aged for at least 2 years, and for half that time in large oak barrels, this wine has an intense nose of ripe fruit, violets and spice.
- The Federalist Visionary Zinfandel, Dry Creek Valley, Sonoma County, California, USA** **52.50**
 Parcels of Zinfandel from Dry Creek Valley vineyards, just about perfect for growing this grape, are fermented separately to preserve the characteristics of each, the average length of time on the skins is 17 days. After pressing and malolactic fermentation in barrels, the wine is matured for 15 months in a mixture of French and American oak barrels, 25% new. Fruit forward with blackberry and black cherry aromas and spicy notes, the palate is balanced and mouth-filling with a rich texture and long finish.

- Don Jacobo Rioja Gran Reserva, Bodegas Corral, Rioja, Spain** 60.00
 This great wine, produced only in classic vintages, sees 22 months in cask before a further seven years in bottle. Made from 85% Tempranillo and 15% Garnacha, it is smooth and silky with enormous complexity and developed fruit flavours.
- Château Teyssier, Saint-Émilion Grand Cru, Bordeaux, France** 47.50
 A château whose vineyards and winemaking has been hugely upgraded under owner Jonathan Maltus since he acquired the property in 1994. Planted with 70% Merlot and 30% Cabernet Franc, meticulous grape selection and minimal handling is employed during the winemaking and the wine is aged for about 12 months in a mixture of new and used French oak barrels. A wine that has a deep colour, fresh fruit expression and good length and balance.
- Valpolicella Classico Superiore Seccal 'Ripasso' Nicolis - Veneto, Italy** 50.00
 Made with Amarone skins to give a dense, sweet fruit, bitter cherry and heady perfume. A real treat and great value. Rounded, medium bodied effort that has plenty of juicy cherry fruit alongside a dark sense of humour. Blackberries, spice, leather and bitter chocolate all have a part to play. A serious but approachable wine with bags of character.
- Garage Wine Co Cabernet Franc Lot #62 - Maipo, Chile** 50.00
 A very convincing, fresh, expressive bouquet with pure brambly, briary black fruit and freshly tilled earth. The palate is medium- bodied to full with crisp black cherry and blueberry fruit. The tannins are fine and edgy, while the finish is beautifully composed and contains Margaux- like femininity.
- Barbaresco, Riva Leone, Piedmont, Italy** 40.00
 The village of Barbaresco, two miles north-east of Alba, stands on a ridge overlooking some of the best vineyards in Piemonte, here the Nebbiolo grape makes well-structured wines with velvety palates. Aged for at least two years, and for half that time in large oak barrels, this wine has an intense nose of ripe fruit, violets and spice.
- Vietti Erbacco Nebbiolo Langhe - Piedmonte, Italy** 55.00
 A handsome wine, rustic and robust texture yet still with a cherryish fruit and a long, elegant finish. Vibrant raspberry and clove aromas over charred red peppers, while the palate demonstrates there's plenty of life left with brisk blackberry fruit embroidered by notes of violets and creamy oak spice.
- Chateau Musar Red, Bekaa Valley, Lebanon** 60.00
 This wine made from grapes grown in the Bekaa Valley, is constructed differently each year; but the style is always emphatically Lebanese: enticingly aromatic, with persistent fruit flavours. There are some constants though; the wine is made from a blend of Cabernet Sauvignon, Cinsault and Carignan and aged for some time, usually about a year, in French Nevers oak. It is bottled in its third year and cellared for four more years prior to release.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Ogier, Rhone Valley, France	70.00
The nose is spicy with surprising floral notes of grass and acacia, evolving onto more classic notes of red berries, menthol brings a beautiful freshness. The attack is ample, with fine tannins and silky length finishing with scents of the 'garrigues'.	
Penfolds Bin 28 Kalimna Shiraz, Australia	50.00
Penfolds is Australia's star winery. A list of its achievements would resemble an epic novel. You can really taste the Aussie sun in this, it's a full bodied, plush Shiraz that's chock full of black jelly bean, red liquorice and redcurrant flavours.	
Amarone della Valpolicella Classico Nicolis - Veneto, Italy	90.00
Heady, dense and rich with chocolate and cherry, this is a particularly fine example of the greatest wine of Valpolicella.	
Brunello di Montalcino, Bottega - Tuscany, Italy	70.00
Dense, dark cherries and a refined, lingering spice at the heart of this gorgeous Brunello. Made by the most consistent estate in the region, from vineyards overlooking Siena.	
Zapata Nicasia Malbec - Mendoza, Argentina	125.00
Possibly the greatest wine in Argentina. Certainly a standard bearer for bold Malbec, with ink, violet, currant, plum, graphite and cedar all melding into a stentorian whole. Steak, beef, more steak.	
2008 Giuseppe Quintarelli Rosso del Bepi Veneto IGT, Italy	200.00
Rich, textured, racy and complex, the '08 Rosso del Bepi wafts from the glass with an explosion of berries, cherries, and figs, all complemented by incense, tobacco, cigar wrapper, umami and earth. This is an intense, hedonistic wine that earns the Quintarelli name!	
2014 Vietti Brunate, Barolo DOCG, Italy	200.00
Intense ruby red. Dry, with generous body, harmoniously balanced and velvety texture. Classic, ripe red-fruit, long finish, rich and very elegant. Spices, violet, plums and intense tar, very typical for the Brunate vineyard. The wine is aged for 32 months between French oak barrels and Slovenian oak casks, Bottled unfiltered on July 2015.	
2015 Chateau de Saint Cosme Gigondas 'Le Claux', Rhone, France	125.00
This has a very rich and deeply ripe nose with a stony, savory edge with coal smoke and blueberries and dark plums on offer. The spice is deeply sewn in and the palate carries such depth and richness with a fleshy expression of pure grenache that was originally planted in 1870 and has been replanted over time. Phenomenal wine with such power and purity.	
2010 Tignanello Piero Antinori	175.00
Humming with energy and life from the very moment you put your nose in the glass, Marchesi Antinori's 2010 Tignanello shows magnificent aromatic layering and an enormous capacity to peel back and reveal itself in beautiful slow motion. This is an articulate wine with a long story to tell about the quality of its profound 2010 fruit.	

Rosé

- Ultimate Provence Rosé, AOP Côtes de Provence 2020** 48.00
The beauty of this wine extends from the bottle to the contents. Layers of raspberry, strawberry fruit in the nose invite you to a gorgeous, yet spicy palate. A fresh wine with great acidity for food..
- The Bulletin Zinfandel Rosé – California, USA** 25.00
If you like it sweet, strawberry and lush, you will adore this wine, it's fun in a bottle.
- La Maglia Rosa Pinot Grigio Blush – Veneto, Italy** 25.00
Off dry, without being sweet, this is dangerously easy to drink and impossibly moreish
- Château d'Esclans Whispering Angel – Provence, France** 50.00
This beautiful salmon-pink Provence rosé has a very pretty scent of crushed strawberries, peach, rose-water and orange blossom. On the palate, it is wonderfully dry and crisp with delicate summer berry fruits balanced by citrus zest acidity and a deliciously creamy finish. A fabulously sophisticated rosé that is perfect for summer picnics or evening aperitif.
- Château de Berne Esprit IGP Méditerranée Rosé 2019** 35.00
A classic Provençal rosé, with a delicate nose of strawberry and cherry. An abundance of fresh red fruit on the palate, with balanced acidity and a crisp finish.
- Sancerre Rosé André Neveu, Loire, France** 45.00
Wonderfully light and fruity, this delicious Sancerre rosé is made from Pinot Noir, providing delicious aromas of fresh strawberries. Crisp and dry on the finish, with classic Loire minerality.
- Secret de Léoube, Château Léoube – Provence, France** 65.00
Distinctly pale and with the most delicate of pear aromas, this dry rose wine is assured and effortless, remarkable for its texture and sensation in the mouth. Made from lower yields, it is delicately scented, cool and yet underlaid with slightly more exotic aromas that betray its Provençal origins – herbs, fennel, a touch of aniseed.
